Village Has Received Nearly \$86 Million In Grants

Since 2009, the Village of Franklin Park has received nearly \$86 million in federal, state, and county grant money which has helped to keep our Village safe, attractive, and thriving.

This remarkable achievement is due to the committed efforts of our Board of Trustees and our dedicated staff. Seeking and applying for grants can be painstaking. It also requires working closely with a variety of county, state, and federal agencies, our state and federal legislators, and our neighboring communities. But by being awarded these grants, the Village can support our neighborhoods and help attract more investment to our community. Most importantly, grant funding supports critical projects while lessening our dependance on property taxes.

Grant funding has allowed us to upgrade streets, keep our infrastructure in good repair, modernize sewers systems, and provide stormwater detention. Having reliable infrastructure enables business growth and expansion right here in Franklin Park. Grant funding has also helped us beautify our Village by planting trees and to implement other environmental initiatives that enhance our quality of life and help keep our property values stable.

Highlighting Village Accomplishments From 2023

As we enter the new year, I would like

to highlight some of the outstanding achievements from 2023. Many of these projects were supported by grant funding:

Our **downtown streetscaping** along Franklin Avenue improved safety and accessibility as we further beautified the area. Improvements include new stamped concrete, beautiful planters, new trash cans, and bike racks. These improvements will help us attract more new businesses and visitors to the downtown area.

The four-story, 110 room Wyndham Garden Hotel in the Franklin Marketplace is on track to be completed in the Fall of 2024 and will bring additional revenue and visitors to our Village. Adjacent to the new hotel, the Village is building a new interior roadway connecting Grand Avenue to the Franklin Marketplace. As part of this new road configuration, two new retail pads were created for future development. The project also included new sidewalks and will feature attractive and sustainable landscaping.

In June, the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Railroad Administration provided the Village with \$8 million to fund a grade separation engineering study of the Canadian Pacific Railway and Kansas City Southern tracks that cross through Franklin Park and will look at closing one or more existing at-grade crossings. The future goal of the project is to provide a safer rail crossing for drivers

and pedestrians while reducing the negative impacts of freight movement.

Franklin Park, along with the Village of River Grove, received a **Quiet Zone Designation** in October. This will eliminate train horns in Franklin Park unless the conductor sees a dangerous situation. The Village completed \$1.2 million in safety upgrades to qualify for this critical designation by utilizing an IDOT rail safety grant that supported improvements to the sidewalks and roadways near the Metra station, including pedestrian gates and traffic control devices that regulate traffic at the crossings.

Thanks to a \$270,000 Green Infrastructure Grant from the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District, we improved the safety and aesthetics of the industrial area along Pacific Avenue from Hawthorn to Dora Street. Asphalt was removed and new landscaping was added including rain gardens which capture and hold precipitation after storms. This will result in fewer flooded streets and basements throughout Franklin Park and the Silver Creek Basin.

Roadway improvements were made on Schiller Boulevard from Mannheim Road to Scott Street. The project also replaced the existing water main and lead service pipes and added a new sidewalk, curb, and gutter.

I will continue to work with our government partners during the remainder of my current term and throughout my next term in office so that we can secure additional grant funds to invest in our neighborhoods and business corridors. I look forward to updating you on our goals and progress over the next several years.
